



COPYRIGHT GUIDANCE FOR POGP PUBLICATIONS

POGP publications are written by experts for POGP involving significant provision of time and resource. The publications are reviewed and updated regularly to remain current. POGP also has ownership of the copyright of the Mitchell Method of Physiological Relaxation. POGP are keen to make these resources available to members for the purposes of education and training. This document provides guidance on the copyright and intellectual property rights considerations that will be applied following requests for the use in part or whole of any POGP publication.

In general, copy requested should be for an individual's own use for educational purposes (journal/academic use), or for the education of other healthcare professionals

How to apply for copyright permission:

1. Requests should be made using the permission form (Use of POGP publications) found on the website in the copyright guidance section or by email and sent to info@pogp.co.uk FAO the POGP Publications Officer

Please note:

If permission is not sought in this way it will be considered a breach of copyright.

2. A response will be provided as soon as possible and confirmed in writing with conditions of the permission specified. A copy of the signed permission form should be returned to POGP

Permission is not required for use of website references used within other healthcare documentation to specific booklets or information sections.

Copyright permission is usually granted for the following requests;

- a single illustration for a single purpose and permission is not transferable
- for short sections of any public information leaflet or academic publication to be reproduced which may include data or related image. Permission for a larger percentage may be granted and the decision will be made per individual request.
- Use of POGP Logo.

This is likely to be granted for **educational purposes to both affiliate and Full** members.

Please note: personal use of POGP logo will only be granted for **Full** POGP members.

Copyright permission is not granted for the following Requests:

- Any copy for use on websites
- Any copy for use on Powerpoint presentations for commercial use
- Any copy requested for commercial production and use within NHS or private healthcare literature

Where copyright has been granted the following must be applied

1. Where permission is granted all copy must be accredited:
“Reproduced with permission of Pelvic Obstetric and Gynaecological Physiotherapy (pogp.csp.org.uk).”

2. Where permission is granted for the use of an image from a POGP booklet – the copyright mark of the artist must be retained.

3. Use of all logos is dependent on the quality of reproduction and as such should adhere to colour control. This will be supplied on granting of copyright permissions.

4. Illustrations must not be amended/ altered or relabeled in any way

5. References in the text will use the following acknowledgement, amendment subject to the referencing style required for publication:

Title of booklet/ publication, Author, Copyright, Year, POGP

Title of article, Author, Journal, Title, Volume, Issue, Year, POGP

For Images/Photographs:

Title of image, Source publication, POGP, Year

6. Where more than one reference is used the references should be in chronological order. Where more than one publication is referenced in one citation then each publication should be separately referenced

7. In the case of textbooks, the editors should ensure that permission is granted for the use of text or diagrams which belong to POGP, and acknowledged as described above.
